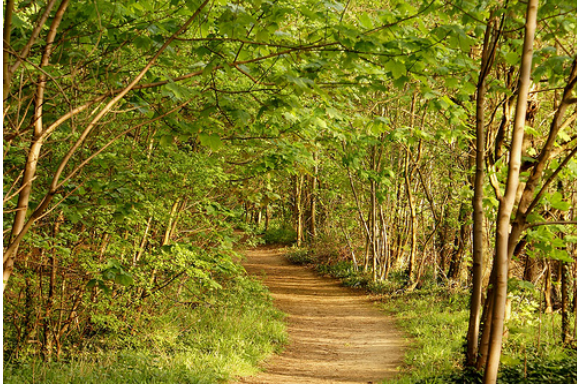


Friends of Harrison Hills Park Presents: Tree Identification Project Hike

The Friends of Harrison Hills Park are very excited to announce Phase One of our Tree Identification Project. This project was inspired by the late George Kurn, a local tree lover and expert. In 2012, George created a publication that catalogued the 64 species of trees and shrubs in the park. As you walk along the trails, you can now learn information about 25 of those species by means of durable signs that list the common name, botanical name, and an interesting fact about that species of tree.

In the future, we hope to have these instructions along with mapping at various locations in the park.
